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2015 Work Plan Preface

After Myanmar Five-Year National Plan of Action to Combat Human Trafficking (2012-2016) has been promulgated, annual work plans are being implemented until now and this is fourth year in 2015.

This 2015 work plan has been drawn up depending on the experiences encountered in the 2014 annual report and actions of combating human trafficking cooperatively by nations in the region, and various changing occurrences of human trafficking forms in the region.

Because Region, State, District, Township Anti-Trafficking Task Forces have been re-formed and basic community-based human trafficking watch groups have also been formed, the Region/State local governments must undertake the anti-trafficking programs and prevention tasks which are appropriate to their areas.

For the reduction and elimination of human trafficking, it is not adequate just by suppressing human trafficking but the works of prevention in advance need to be done. The main cause of human trafficking need to be explored and exposed and the basic root problems need to be addressed effectively.

In performing the respective sectors in this work plan, not only the present undertaking relevant Ministries, United Nations, International Organizations, local social organizations, non-government social organizations but also the roles of media and private sector need to be promoted step by step, as well as it needs to cooperate with not only Thailand and China but also other countries which are solving human trafficking problems and relative problems.

Moreover, this year is the year to promote private sector. In addition, it must work hand in hand with other countries which are giving special priority to the anti-trafficking tasks.

Therefore, by means of implementing practically 2015 work plan, it will impact much on the prevention of human trafficking.
